1.1. Traditional wine show scoring

Wines are rated on a scale of zero to twenty with points allocated as;

Appearance – 3 points Nose – 7 points Palate – 10 points

The following table gives some guidelines for a modified wine show scoring system.

It appeared in its original form in 'The World of Fine Wine' Magazine (Issue 18, 2007), which was then modified by Steve Webber (De Bortoli) and Andrew Graham (Australian Wine Review).

This table, especially the descriptions will help when you are reviewing wines.
